Absentee Ballot counts can change elections results on Election Day

General Election Day is Tuesday Nov 8. There are several ways to cast your ballot.

- At a Precinct Polling Place on Election Day
- At a Division of Elections Early Voting Location on Election Day
- At a Division of Elections Absentee, In-Person Location on or before Election Day, or
- Order an Absentee By-Mail Ballot from DOE & mail your completed ballot to DOE
 - Absentee Ballot By-Mail must be signed, witnessed & postmarked on, or before Election Day

Candidates that have spent numerous hours door to door, social media and phone contacts have been disappointed to find out that even though they won on Election Day, after the absentee votes have been counted, they were defeated.

Mailing your absentee ballot on Election Day is considered valid for 45 days after the actual in person election vote.

Your absentee vote is **so important**. The diligent effort on your part to mail your ballot will be effective in 2022 elections. You may not be aware of the Candidates issues or platform at the time you mail in your absentee ballot.
